1 ½ cups	high-fiber wheat bran cereal	375 ml
2 cups	buttermilk	500 ml
½ cup	canola oil	125 ml
1/3 cup	molasses	75 ml
2	eggs, beaten	2
1 tsp	vanilla extract	5 ml
1 cup	whole wheat flour	250 ml
1 cup	all-purpose flour	250 ml
1 cup	oat bran	250 ml
½ cup	granular low-calorie sweetener with sucralose or splenda	125 ml
1/3 cup	granulated sugar	75 ml
1 tbs	baking soda	15 ml

In bowl, stir boiling water into wheat bran cereal; let cool for 10 minutes. Stir in buttermilk, oil, molasses, eggs and vanilla. In large bowl, combine flours, oat bran, sweetener, sugar and baking soda. Add buttermilk mixture, stir just until moistened. Cover tightly and refrigerate for up to 2 weeks. To make muffins: using ¼ cup (50 ml) measure, place batter in nonstick medium muffin cups, filling ¾ full. Bake in 375°F (190°C) oven for 20 minutes or until muffins are firm to the touch.

- Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Quilt will be selected at the annual convention of OAAS.
- Upon making an entry into the Ontario Agricultural Societies' Quilt Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- Winner's name to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- Long arm machine quilting not eligible for OAAS competition.

ANNUAL MACHINE-QUILTING COMPETITION

Eligibility, rules and regulations:

- Entries must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) Fair to be eligible for this competition. Shawville Fair is a member of this society.
- Entries to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 192 inches or 480 cm. Note the article can be square, rectangular, etc.
- Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Machine Quilted Article will be selected at the annual OAAS Convention.
- Upon making entry into the OAAS Machine Quilting Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- The winning OAAS Champion Machine Quilted Article will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or OAAS Provincial competition.
- The winner's name to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- The entry must **not** be quilted using a long arm machine and must be machine quilted by the exhibitor.
- Article must have visible machine quilting.
