

## ATTENTION ALL ANIMAL EXHIBITORS

Please take note that all animals arriving on the Fair grounds may be clinically examined for contagious diseases by a veterinarian. Animals having such diseases will be subject to refusal to the Fair. The decision of the veterinarian is final. Pontiac Agricultural Society is not liable for any diseases passed from animals at the Fair.

**Every exhibitor is required to forward with their entry form a certificate of proof of liability insurance for the current year (minimum of \$1,000,000 is required), copy of negative coggins test within the period of two years preceeding the first day of the Fair, and membership fee. Entries will not be processed until this information is received, and will be subject to late entry fee of 25% of gross prize money. Entries are to be sent ONLY to Pontiac Agricultural Society, Box 149, Shawville, QC J0X 2Y0. Entries must be received in the Fair office or postmarked by August 10, 2010.**

## ATTENTION ALL HORSEMEN

NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST WITHIN THE PERIOD OF TWO YEARS PRECEEDING THE FIRST DAY OF THE FAIR IS TO BE MAILED WITH ENTRIES. AS THERE MAY BE A VETERINARIAN ON THE GROUNDS CHECKING FOR COGGINS, PLEASE DO HAVE PAPERS AVAILABLE.

Take particular note of the following regulations:

-All exhibitors must become members of the Pontiac Agricultural Society.

**-Every exhibitor is required to forward with their entry form a certificate of proof of liability insurance for the current year (minimum of \$1,000,000 is required), copy of negative coggins test within the period of two years preceeding the first day of the Fair, and membership fee. Entries will not be processed until this information is received, and will be subject to late entry fee of 25% of gross prize money. Entries are to be sent ONLY to Pontiac Agricultural Society, Box 149, Shawville, QC J0X 2Y0. Entries must be received in the Fair office or postmarked by August 10, 2010.**

-It is necessary to complete the entry form, using registered name.

-The registration number must be included on the entry form.

-If identification is by tattoo this must be listed.

-No prize money shall be paid without all the necessary information.

-All horses must have had Coggins test.

-The ringmaster has the final decision in barring exhibitors from showing horses or ponies in classes other than the proper class.

-Horse and pony exhibitors must be on time when their class is called. If not, the judge or ringmaster may rule that they will not be allowed to show in the class in question.

-Exhibitors of registered stock must furnish papers if asked to do so by the ringmaster in charge.

-No registered animal may show single in a grade class if a registered class is available.

-All horses whether owned by one person or by more than one person, individually or jointly, which are maintained on one farm or breeding unit, are considered to be the production of such unit. Therefore, only two entries per class are eligible from such farm or breeding unit, except for western horses.

-Brood mares must be accompanied by their foals in order to enable the judges to determine their quality as such.

-No animal may travel faster than a walk, except in the show ring.

-Horses shall be kept in the areas allotted for showing and exercise.

-Any horse acting in an unruly manner may be evicted from the Fair grounds.

-Any exhibitor interfering with another exhibitor shall forfeit his/her prize.

-If an offence by an exhibitor or judge shall, in the judgment of the majority of the members of the ring committee, require immediate action the committee shall forthwith investigate the offence and may disqualify such person from further participation. Such disqualifications shall render said person not in good standing at Shawville Fair.

-Misrepresentations of the identity of a horse through falsification of name, number or descriptive material on an entry form, or the substitution in the show ring of a horse other than the one named on the entry form for the class in question, shall result in the forfeiture by the exhibitor of any ribbon, trophy, cash prize or other award won by such misrepresentation or substitution and shall render the exhibitor liable to the penalty described for same in Canadian Equestrian Federation Rule Book. It shall be the duty of the horse show committee to take action as above without awaiting protest.

-Entries shall be shown without artificial appliances except as allowed by the Canadian Equestrian Federation rules and regulations.

-Any Exhibitor may be disqualified from exhibiting at Shawville Fair and forfeit prize money won if a written complaint is filed with the chairman of the horse committee during the Fair that said exhibitor showed his animal or animals while under the influence of intoxicating beverages or drugs. Such decision to impose the necessary penalty shall be made by the chairman of the horse committee and ring committee. **THIS RULE WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.**

-The inhumane beating or abuse of a horse by an exhibitor, trainer, or any other person shall not be tolerated. The chairman and ring committee shall have the right to disqualify.

-Protests shall be lodged with the secretary on the day of showing. All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by \$100.00 cash or certified cheque, and the Director in charge will decide. Their decision is final.

-Allocation of stalls will be first come first served. Allocation of stalls in all horse barns will be decided on a basis of entries at 8:00 a.m. No tack stalls are available. Allocation of space for trailers will be first come first served.

- Where only one entry is shown in a class, 2<sup>nd</sup> place prize money may be paid.
- Exhibitors must remain on the Fair grounds until the finish of the show involved.
- Pontiac Agricultural Society is not liable for any diseases passed from animals at the Fair.
- It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall so hold the Pontiac Agricultural Society and/or the committee blameless for any loss or accident. It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall be responsible for any injury or damage that may be occasioned to any person or thing whomever or whatever against all claims or demands for loss or damage occasioned thereby.
- Children under the age of 6 years will not be allowed in any of the livestock buildings unless accompanied by an adult.
- No dogs are allowed on the grounds.
- Volunteer exhibitors are needed for cleanup after show.

-As a limited number of stalls are available they will be allotted on a first come first serve basis. **NO RESERVATIONS.**

-Only one entry form is to be used for each exhibitor. If more forms are required, call the Fair office at 819-647-3213 or photocopy.

-Exhibitors may bring in animals after 8:00 p.m. Saturday night.

-Exhibitors may pick up their show ring number(s) or make any entry changes on the morning of Sunday, September 5 from 7:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. in the arena.

-No cross entering will be allowed. Horses or ponies entered in one division cannot show in any other division except in the "Special Classes".

-All horses and ponies are subject to measurement which will be made in accordance with the C.E.F. rules and regulations.

-Stallions are not eligible in any ladies or children's classes.

-To be eligible for entry in a stake class, the animals must have been entered, shown and judged in at least one other class in the division in which the stake is offered.

-No classes will be changed or moved and will be judged in the order as they appear in this book.

-All exhibitors and attendants must be neatly and appropriately attired upon entering the ring.

-Joint ownership is permitted in pair classes.

-Each exhibitor is subject to and should be familiar with the by-laws of the Pontiac Agricultural Society, which are found in this book and with all the horsemen rules found at the beginning of the horse section.

**-Working trailers may only be parked in the area designated by the Director. Trailer space will be allocated on a first come, first served basis.**

-Passes are allotted as: helper – 1 pass for 4 or more horses; vehicle – 1 pass for 4 horses, maximum of 2, the second vehicle must park off-site. Passes will be distributed after animals have been checked in by the Director.
